Sculpture 3

An Interactive Marine Instrument

An imaginative nautical device enables viewers to peer through a scope at a North Square scene from another era.

Near the former Seamen's Bethel.

The sculpture brings far away moments, rather than a faraway view, closer.

Sculpture 2

A Story Repository Map

Connects to stories of immigrants who have called North Square home.

Can be indexed to an online multimedia archive of North Square stories.

Located in relation to the Freedom Trail.

The map is a scaled view onto a big history.

Sculpture 1

An Historical Colonial Relief

Represents early life in North Square, with a view to the busy waterfront.

Located in relation to Paul Revere House.

Looking at a sculpture of a landscape, viewers see a wide vista in a small frame.

Sculpture 4

A Woman Looks From A Cave

From the confines of her cave she peers out at the Boston skyline, just as Santa Rosalia gazes towards Palermo Harbor.

Near St. John School and Sacred Heart Church.

Could be made in collaboration with groups of local school children.
